### Mike Shadrack on "Little Hostas" Joint meeting with Hosta Society Saturday, April 11

The Capital Hudson Iris Society and the Upstate New York Hosta Society will meet jointly at the East Greenbush Community Library on **Saturday**, April 11, for a presentation by one of our favorite and most entertaining speakers, Mike Shadrack. Both clubs are bringing him in from the Buffalo area to give a talk on "Little Hostas". This is a meeting not to be missed.

Mike Shadrack has been growing hostas since 1986 and has been trying to hybridize almost as long. He came to hostas through his other hobby, fish-keeping, when the beauty of hostas reflected in the garden pond was drawn to his attention in a TV gardening program. He now has many more hostas than fish and now gardens in Hamburg, New York, where with his wife Kathy Guest Shadrack he maintains a large collection of modern cultivars and a garden devoted to small hostas. Their place is called Smug Creek Gardens and you can visit it on the web.

In 1996, Mike retired from London's Metropolitan Police after thirty-two years service and has rarely sat down since. As a police officer he served in many parts of London including Soho and Whitechapel, and at Scotland Yard where he was responsible for Public Order and Ceremonial planning. He is also a qualified London Tourist Board Guide and organizes garden tours both in England and specialized hosta tours in the US. You can ask about them!

We're sure to be treated to some spectacular photographs since Mike has more than 5800 slides of hostas and hosta gardens, and has published numerous books on the subject, as well as contributing photos to other authors. He's president of the Western New York Hosta Society and belongs to the American and British Hosta Societies. Kathy Guest Shadrack also writes hosta books and is well known to some of our group because of her past work with the Western New York Iris Society.

The East Greenbush Community Library is located on Community Way, off Michaels Road in East Greenbush. From Albany or I-787, take the Patroon Island Bridge to Exit 9 and go south on Route 4 for about a half mile to Route 151 going east, ¾ of the way around the traffic circle. Michaels Road is the second right off Route 151. Bring a dessert or snack to share, bring a friend or two, and prepare to enjoy yourself. Coffee and goodies start at 1:30 and the meeting will begin at 2:00. If you have any questions, call Euthemia at 439-3758 or write her an email.
