Business Meeting April 11

We Need Your Perennials!

The Siberian Iris and Perennial Sale is on Sunday, May 17. Many of you come to buy, but we also need you to bring some plants to sell. I'm sure you have perennials that need dividing, that you have too much of, and that you think others would like to have. If so, please pot them up and mark them carefully with the plant name (Latin if you know it or can look it up on the internet) and ideally the cultivar, color and approximately how tall it gets. Get to the sale early so we can put a permanent marker on it and price the plant. No plant is priced under \$2 and if it's really good, it can go for \$10 or more. Plants that sell well include fancy hostas, daylilies if you know the color, anything in flower, and anything that you know people love. Call Euthemia at 439-3758 if you have any questions.

Bud-fly: Do you have this?

For the past few years I've had a couple problems with my iris: buds that turn brown and mushy, and iris blooms with missing or distorted segments. I blamed the first on too much rain during the cold spring months and the second on herbicide drift. Last year I read an article in the Canadian Iris Society Summer 2012 issue which revealed a possible cause: the larva of Neorthochaeta dissimilus, or iris bud fly. I split open a mushy bud and there it was – a small white worm. The larvae burrow into the side of a bud and eat the pollen, damaging the blossom. I went through the garden and removed all the affected buds, split them to check for the presence of the larva, placed the bud into a sealed plastic bag and disposed of them in the trash bin. If there was no larva in the bud I cut the stem below the bud and disposed of that. I hope this will control it. If not, I'll try sticky traps next year. - Kathryn Mohr
