Sunday, May 15th: Siberian Iris and Perennial Sale

We're now into our "heavy" months of iris activity. The **Siberian Iris and Perennial Sale**, which many of you wait all year for, will be on Sunday, May 15th from 9-12 at Main Square Shoppes Parking Lot, 318 Delaware Avenue, Delmar, rain or shine. We have more than 300 Siberian and species cross irises (which are like Siberians) all potted and ready to plant and they're only \$5 each! We also have a wide selection of perennials, many from our member's gardens, from \$3 up. In addition, there will be some special perennials from a wholesaler that we sell below retail cost.

For those of you who will be helping with the sale or donating potted perennials, please arrive by 7:30 for set-up. Plants should be marked with the name of the cultivar, color and, if possible, the height of the full-grown plant. Use a Sharpie or other permanent marker. If you need pricing guidance, labels cut from old thin-slat venetian blinds or other materials, or information in general, call Euthemia at 439-3758.

As most of you know, it's a great sale and a perfect opportunity to add to your garden collections. If you'd like an advance list of the irises we will have and a short description of each one, send e-mail to Euthemia@nycap.rr.com and you'll get one. Label your Bearded Iríses

As your bearded irises begin to bloom, it's a good time to label them, and to mark where one begins and another ends if they've been growing together. Then you'll know what you've got and where to dig those you want to divide for the Rhizome Dig on July 30th at Euthemia's home. If you don't label them well, you won't know what to dig – and you know you've GOT to divide some of those rhizomes right away!

At the dig we'll take your clumps, clean and divide them into separate rhizomes, mark each rhizome with a label with the name and description of the rhizome, put them into a bag that has a picture and description of the rhizome on it, and we'll bring the hundreds of bags of rhizomes to the Rhizome Sale at Faddegon's Nursery on Saturday, August 6th. It's always a great sale.

Phyllis Rosenblum: Vegetable Gardening 101

Phyllis Rosenblum, a Master Gardener Volunteer since 1977, covered the basics of starting a vegetable garden. The most important step is choosing the correct site for the garden. You want full sun (6 hours between 10 am - 4 pm is good), well-drained soil, simple access to water, and good soil – the ideal is loam with a pH of 6.4-6.8.

The vegetables can be divided into 4 groups which should be rotated every year to reduce the chance of disease:

- 1. Tomatoes, Eggplants, Peppers
- 2. Broccoli, Kale, Cabbage
- 3. Beans, Legumes
- 4. Cucumbers, Squash

Vegetables that can be planted early in the spring are lettuces, spinach, kale, radishes, leeks, and onion sets. Warm weather crops usually are planted sometime between May 15-30.

A good way to make use of a small space is intercropping, planting earlier small plants among larger late ones and successive planting of cold/warm/cold weather plants.

The question of whether to use chemicals in the garden was raised. Phyllis cautioned that, if used, it is important to educate yourself, reading the label and applying the proper concentration at the proper time. Since we aren't dependent on the crops we grow in our gardens, maybe we don't need to use chemicals.

Raised beds can be built of cement blocks, bricks, stone, or wood. They should contain 6-8 inches of soil. She cautioned not to start too big and that a 4x8 foot size was manageable.

One last tidbit was that you can intersperse vegetable plants (think Swiss chard) in among your flowers.
