RVP Message

Neil Houghton, President and AIS Region 2 RVP



Happy New Year

Expressing our gratefulness is something that always seems to fall short, to be inadequate. The leadership of Kathryn and the entire AIS Board and Committee chairs has kept us moving forward even when there were cancelled shows and in person Regional Meetings. It must have felt like a Sisyphean task. But labor on they did! Thank you all.

It is my pleasure to attempt to lead such a well-informed group of iris experts. "Lead" is not the right word, "attempt" certainly is. Perhaps facilitate better describes the role.

Haven't we had quite a time over the last two years? I don't think any of us would go through it again if we could choose. Buried in the mucky mess a few seeds were planted that bloomed. One of these might be the hope for our revival. It is our use of Zoom. Nothing replaces face to face meeting and learning. Zoom did, however, bring new opportunities for us to collapse distances to make many things possible. As your new Regional Vice President, I want us to cultivate this opportunity and build on it.

Relatively new to the iris world, I caught the bug twenty years ago when Kyle and I moved to a new house. The condo's Homeowner's Association had no issue when Kyle moved from Atlanta to join me. They did take issue with the three dogs that came with him. We quickly bought a house with a half-acre of property and my single iris was soon joined by a few more. Now half the yard is irises.

Kyle and I were married in Toronto City Hall in 2008. I am thrilled to have a more concrete connection to the country, now.

After 35 years teaching elementary school, I retired in 2008. I served on many curriculum development committees and as various Union officers. Since the 1990's I worked with a not-for-profit organization and became a member of the Board of Directors and was a member of the Vestry at my church. Though I have little experience in horticulture, I have lots in pedagogy! Many of these groups involved training in efficient group functioning. When we were getting paid, they wanted us to be productive.

While I cannot in any way add to the knowledge base of this wonderful group of irisarians, I do hope that my experience in other areas will prove useful. Just like every social group we are struggling to maintain, let alone grow members. It is my hope that some of my experience working with groups can be helpful in turning visitors into returning visitors and finally into members. The AIS has developed a 5-year Membership Plan. We will be hearing more about it. This plan won't work by itself. Local action is the key to using it!

My experience as a teacher (and aren't we all teachers?) tells me that the first rule is to listen to your audience, to restate what you heard to confirm understanding. For teachers this was referred to as avoiding being the "sage on the stage." For kids it was "we have one mouth and two ears." Listen more than you speak.

If this sounds condescending, I don't mean that anyone must change everything they are doing, but simply be aware when you or someone is not listening to needs of the other members or visitors.

One last idea: We have many members that are in areas where an affiliate is not available. The preferable solution would be to start these groups or re-establish them. It is a long-term goal. In the meantime, let's act as a Region. We have had many Zoom experiences that have brought us together. Our monthly Zoom meeting provide an opportunity to have an interactive experience. In short, local activities that can be shared Region-wide will benefit us all.

2021 Tall Bearded Iris Symposium Region 2 Top 11

(American Iris Society Results vs Region 2 Favorites)

Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2021 AIS Tall Bearded Iris Symposium. It was nice that we could venture out to admire the irises growing in the gardens of others. Your input is valuable on two levels. At a national level, it ensures the region has fair representation in the results while at the regional level, your selections give other Region 2 members an idea of what will grow well in our climate.

We continue to select award winners of all types. Award of Merit, Wister Medal, and Dykes Medal winners are all included in this list. 'Immortality' has held the number one position since 2018, a testament to the quality of this forty-year-old iris. Some irises are appearing for the first time while others are returning after a brief hiatus. This coincides with the patterns in my garden i.e. an iris will bloom well one year but may not the next, depending on the weather.

2021 Rebloom Season In Region 2

When do irises start to rebloom in your garden? What irises have rebloomed in your garden? These are questions we should be asking each other so we can share our rebloom successes.

Our garden in Ontario is considered Canadian zone 5b (approx. USDA zone 6). Weather conditions are a big factor in any rebloom season, and as a result, no two seasons are the same. In a good year, rebloom starts in our garden in late August and continues until there is a hard frost which usually occurs in late November/early December. An early frost or snowfall can shorten the season by weeks while a dry autumn can result in little or no rebloom. However, the Autumn of 2021, was one of our better years, and irises rebloomed from August 29 until November 21. No complaints here!



IB 'Precious Little Pink' (Byers, 1995) is an iris we would not be without. This iris put up a multitude of bloom stalks in late August. Just when we thought it was finished, another flourish of bloom stalks would appear. By late November, and with a hard frost in the forecast, the final three stalks were brought indoors for us to enjoy (pictured left © K. Brewitt).

MTB 'Lady Emma' (F. Jones, 1986) is an iris that reblooms

reliably in our garden. She usually makes an appearance around our Canadian Thanksgiving (first Monday in October) and blooms for about four weeks. This year she put up seven bloom stalks the

first week of November. Again, a threat of frost resulted in the stalks being brought indoors to finish their bloom (*pictured right* © *K. Brewitt*).

Other irises to rebloom were TB 'Starring Encore' (Spoon, 2008) which bloomed from the end of September through to the end of October, and SDB 'Ray Jones' (Spoon, 2011) which bloomed from mid-October until early November.



'Immortality' (Zurbrigg, 1982) is a reliable reblooming iris for many members in our Region. Every year there are rebloom sightings throughout Ontario and New York State. This year Wendy Roller, who lives in New York State USDA zone 6b, reported "...(seeing) it all over our area from late August onwards. I was able to enjoy a nice clump each day on my walk around the neighborhood. Some of the garden centers have been selling it the last several years. Obviously, it is establishing nicely in our area."



SDB 'Sun Doll' (B. Jones, 1985) is another iris Wendy reported reblooming in New York State, though not a registered rebloomer. She says it sends up a lot of spring bloom and is a great increaser. The color is very recognizable across the garden. Although she has never had it rebloom in her yard, a family member has a huge planting in a raised landscape bed behind her house. The plant gets lots of warmth from the garden path bricks all around the raised concrete block bed. This year it put up a single stalk in mid-late September. (photo © Don McQueen)

Wendy also reported that IB 'Many Mahalos' (Aitken, 2003) put up a quality "spring-type" stalk in mid-October. She goes on to say, "(i)t took awhile to develop but finally started to bloom on November 11th. Only one blossom opened before the frost hit the plant. However, that one flower stayed open for 8 days. It was definitely a late fall "over-achiever." Another stalk tried to develop but only sent up a stalk with one bud. It never opened. I finally cut the stalk down right before Christmas – at that point another stalk was trying to develop on the plant. I wonder what my spring bloom will be like next year?!" (photo © Irisu Pasaulis)





Other members throughout Region 2 enjoyed rebloom in their gardens as well. This year there were reports of rebloom on SDB 'Autumn Jester' (Chapman, 2000), SDB 'Baby Blessed' (Zurbrigg, 1979), MDB 'Forever Violet' (Chapman, 2002), and SDB 'Perpetual Indulgence' (Aitken, 2005).

New Way to Look Up Your AIS Membership Expiry Date

Scroll down to *'Check Membership Status'* then click on the link to bring up a list of all AIS members. To find your record you can type your last name in the search box (case-sensitive) found above the *'Membership Good Through'* column. You can also sort the listing by region (R02 – for Region 2), by name (first or last) or by expiry date (sorted alphabetically by month).



The Wirz-Rettig Award (highest-placed Japanese Iris of the Show) had not been assigned.




