"Container Gardening: A Guide to Beautiful and Bountiful Pots!"

On Sunday, April 29, 1:30 p.m., at the East Greenbush Community Library, Christine Saplin will give a talk on "Container Gardening – A Guide to Beautiful and Bountiful Pots!" The meeting will be our final presentation of the season before we begin our iris prep parties, sales, show and bus trip season. The weather promises to really deliver spring by this date and we'll all be ready to plant some beautiful pots.

Christine Saplin comes to us via the Albany County Cooperative Extension Master Gardener program. She has been a volunteer with the Master Gardeners since 2012 and enjoyed gardening for over 40 years. She originally became interested in the Master Gardener program because it offered her the opportunity to work with young students and help them become gardeners. It has become an extension of her career in education.

The program will explore the basics of container gardening as well as the potential that containers offer in growing ornamental plants and vegetables. In her power point presentation she will have lots of pictures of fully grown containers for us to ooo and aah at! Christine hopes that you will come with many questions for her as she explores this fun and inspiring subject.

The East Greenbush Community Library is located on Community Way, off Michaels Road in East Greenbush, New York. The library doors open at 1:00. Coffee and goodies begin at 1:30, a short business meeting at 2:00 and Christine will begin her talk right after that. Bus trip to Elizabeth Park

The CHIS Bus trip this year will be to Elizabeth Park Gardens in Hartford, CT on **Sunday, June 10**, from 8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. The park is particularly famous for its rose gardens. On the way home we will stop at John O'Brien Nursery in East Granby so you have an opportunity to bring home some of his beautiful perennials (especially hosta) and shrubs. Bring a cardboard box with your name on it for storage of your plants on the bus. The cost of the trip (including bagels and juice on the bus) is \$40 round trip. **This year, pre-registration is required. The registration form is attached to this newsletter.** Send in the form and payment as soon as possible – this trip will fill up fast, and it's first come, first served. Sunday, May 20, Siberian Iris and Perennial Sale

We'll be careful to wash all roots in bleach solution and pot plants in sterile soil-less mix. And as usual, there will be a special selection of perennials from a wholesaler that we sell at discounted prices. It's a wonderful sale, people come back year after year to replenish their gardens with plants guaranteed to grow in our climate.

March meeting on Native Plants

The last half of our two-part series on gardening with native plants featured Karin Ursula Edmondson, a landscape designer who works primarily throughout the Catskills (www.kulandscapes.com). Karin designs, builds and maintains ecological gardens on properties large and small, with a strong emphasis on incorporating native plants in her palette. Her program included many examples of her beautiful work such as meadows, forested areas, poolside gardens and rockeries. She is a firm believer in the circle of life concept: that by planting native species we then encourage beneficial native insects, birds and animals to frequent our gardens. She enthusiastically recommended a trip to the Catskill Native Nursery in Kerhonkson, NY where she sources much of her native plant material. – Dan Maier

Capital Hudson Iris Society is sponsoring a bus trip to Elizabeth Park Gardens in Hartford, Connecticut, on Sunday, June 10. The Wade bus will leave Crossgates Mall upper peripheral parking lot on the west side of the mall at 8:00 a.m. sharp, so be on time! The cost is \$40 per person including a bagel and juice breakfast on the bus. Fill out the form below, enclose a check made out to **CHIS**, and send it to the address indicated. Reservations will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Elizabeth Park has many gardens to visit. Established in 1904, the Elizabeth Park Rose Garden is the oldest municipal rose garden and the third largest in the United States today. In addition, the Heritage Rose Garden, with the magnificent fragrances of old roses, is known throughout the country. The Perennial Garden was redesigned by Frederick McGourty in the 1980s and over 1600 new perennials were added. There are annual gardens, a shade garden, greenhouses, a Pond House Garden with a café, ponds and stone bridges. You won't be bored at Elizabeth Park and you'll probably have a hard time seeing it all in one day. Log onto www.elizabethparkct.org to get a hint of what's in store.

On the way home, we will stop at John O'Brien's Nursery in East Granby, Connecticut, where you will be able to buy beautiful perennials, shrubs and their specialty, hosta. They have hundreds of hosta. Be sure to bring a large carton or two with you to store your purchases under the bus.
