## August 1<sup>st</sup> Rhizome Party and August 4<sup>th</sup> Rhizome Sale

The Iris Rhizome Dig is on Wednesday, August 1<sup>st</sup> at the home of Euthemia Matsoukas, 13 Hartwood Road, Delmar, from 9-12. At the dig we'll take your clumps of clearly labeled irises (put them in separate plastic bags and write on the outside of the bag which one is inside), we'll clean, trim and divide them into separate rhizomes, and mark each rhizome with a label that has the name and description of the flower. Then we put them into a bag that has a picture and description of the iris on it and bring the bags of rhizomes to the Rhizome Sale at Faddegon's Nursery on Saturday, August 4<sup>th</sup>. Anyone planning on digging irises from their garden should **let Euthemia know their names right away**. She'll make labels and pictures for the bags so the work goes quickly at the Dig. In addition to what we dig here, Bob and Ann Keup are planning to send some of their bearded irises from Maine for the sale.

Even if you don't have any irises to contribute to the sale, your help will be appreciated at the dig. As you can tell from the above description, it's a process to prepare the irises, and people are needed at every level. Besides, you'll enjoy the camaraderie and learning as well as the coffee and bagels! So if you're retired or not working, or can take the morning off, please come!

The sale is just a few days later, on Saturday, August 4<sup>th</sup>, from 9-12 at Faddegon's Nursery, 1140 Troy-Schenectady Road (Route 7) in Latham. As everyone who has been there knows, the Rhizome Sale is the best place to buy new bearded irises! Let your friends know about the sale and bring them.

### Reserve October 19 & 20 for Region 2 Meeting Hosted by CHIS

Many of you will remember the last time CHIS hosted the Region 2 meeting at the Delmar Presbyterian Church four years ago. It's our turn again and we have a great speaker who will also give two judges' trainings, a potluck luncheon, and a silent auction on the agenda. The guest speaker is Bonnie Nichols, President of the Novelty Iris Society, a relatively new subgroup of the American Iris Society. Bonnie hails from Mesquite, Texas, is a hybridizer and sells irises from her Hillcrest Iris and Daylily Gardens that she operates with her husband. Her keynote speech "Novelty Irises: Looking Forward, Looking Back" will give us a good background on novelties and let us know what's in the works for the future. Novelties are irises with broken color, an odd number of falls, perhaps no standards, space age irises with horns (some fuzzy) and hooks, flatties, those with variegated foliage, and overlapping falls. Obviously not all on one iris! She's a great speaker and the weekend promises to be both educational and enjoyable. Be sure to put it on your calendar.

If you are a CHIS member, please bring a dish to share for the potluck luncheon, something you're good at making and that others will enjoy. If you want some guidance, call Euthemia and she'll be glad to help. There will be more on the meeting including a registration form in the September newsletter.

#### Results of Iris Show

Virginia Dorwaldt was the star of the June 2<sup>nd</sup> Iris Show this year, winning Best Specimen (Ace, MTB), Best Tall Bearded/Border Bearded (Joyce Terry), Best Miniature Tall Bearded (Ace), and Best Historic Iris (Tom Tit). There were no awards for Siberians because not enough exhibitors and specimens were shown. Kathryn Mohr won the Silver Medal for most blue ribbons, and Virginia won the Bronze Medal for second most blues. Virginia also received the Bob and Ann Keup Award for Best Tall Bearded Iris (Joyce Terry).

We want to encourage more of you to submit irises for the show next year. When you buy new irises at the Rhizome Sale on August  $4^{th}$ , be sure to label them well, perhaps even draw a map of where you've planted which iris, and then you'll have a named variety to submit for judging next June. It's a fun experience and we hope to have more entries next year.
